

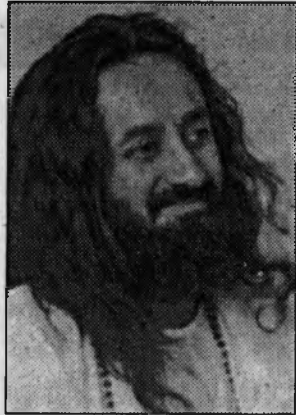
# Sir Penrose, Dr Goodall to address event today

SSQ-II, which is a four-year international programme by the Centre of Theology and Natural Sciences in Berkeley, California has been busy holding many conferences and workshops to bridge the gap between the scientific deductions and spiritual prac-

tices.

The main speakers at this discourse will be Sir Roger Penrose, a professor of mathematics who has gained acclaim with his research in geometry and his attempt to unite Einstein's theory of relativity with quantum physics and Dr Jane Goodall, a primatologist, environmentalist and animal activist.

Apart from this, Sri Sri Ravi Shankar, the founder of The Art of Living Foundation, a United Nations' non governmental organisation, will also address the gathering at the event on the main ideal of living, which is service and the promotion of human values.

Prof. Philip Clayton, a Harvard University professor and one of the principal investigators of the SSQ programme will also delve deeper into the subject of spirituality and science.

The event has been organised jointly by the K.H. Foundation and DNA Networks.

The K.H. foundation was established in 1994 in memory of Kengal Hanumanthaiya, former chief minister of Karnataka and is chaired by Ms Vijayalakshmi Thimmaiah, the daughter of late K. Hanumanthaiya. Venkat Vardhan, from DNA Networks, will deliver the introductory address.
