Bangalore, March 16: Two senior scientists and seven young scientists were presented Sir M. Visvesvaraya Award and Sir C.V. Raman Awards respectively for their outstanding work in various scientific fields. The function was organised by the Planning Institutional Finance and Statistics and Science and Technology Department along with the Karnataka State Council for Science and Technology at Vidhana Soudha on Monday.
